The Competition Period for Ski Jumping is 18 January to 21 January (including Official Training). The competition will take place at the Alpensia Ski Jump Centre.

TEAM CAPTAIN MEETING(TCM)

The first Team Captain Meeting (TCM) of Ski Jumping will be held on 17 January at the Competition Venue (Athletes' Lounge). The complete TCM schedule will be published as an appendix after DCAS is completed.

SPORT INFORMATION DESK (SID)

The Sport Information Desk (SID) will be operated at the competition venue and the Youth Olympic Village Gangneung (YVG).

At the Competition Venue for the Ski Jumping, the SID will be located in the Race Office. Volunteers will provide general sport information for Ski Jumping and assist with basic requirements and inquiries.

EVENTS

There will be three (3) Ski Jumping events in total:

Women's Event	Men's Event	Mixed Team Event

COMPETITION FORMAT

During Gangwon 2024, there will be three (3) events in Ski Jumping. All these competitions will take place at the Alpensia Ski Jump Centre. The competition formats are the following.

INDIVIDUAL EVENT

Prior to the competition, a voluntary trial jump (round) will be held for the competitors. The competition consists of a two rounds. All competitors take part in the first round.

The start interval between each competitor is approximately 45-50 seconds. The green starting signal indicates to competitors that the hill is clear, and that they must start within the next 10 seconds (start control time). A competitor who does not leave the starting gate within the 10-second period will be disqualified.

The starting order for the training, trial, and first competition rounds is drawn randomly. In the final round, competitors start in reverse order based on the results from the first round.

MIXED TEAM EVENT

For team competitions, each team will be made up of four competitors.

The start order of the competitors will be decided at the team captains' meeting.

For both the trial round and the two official competitive jumps, four groups will compete, with one jumper from each team per group. The sequential numbers of each group member are determined by a specific colour:

- Group I - Red start numbers
- Group II - Green start numbers
- Group III - Yellow start numbers
- Group IV - Blue start numbers.

Within a group, the start order of the team (nation) members is selected in the draw. Each team decides the order in which its jumpers will start. The competitors must remain in the same group for the trial round and both competitive jumps. Immediately after drawing the team order, a list with the starting order of the jumpers within the team must be submitted to the Competition Committee.

I RULES

EVALUATION OF SKI JUMPING COMPETITION

The overall score in the Ski Jumping competition is the sum of points from one round, which is calculated using the following:

- Points for jumping distance (metres converted to distance points)
- Points for jumping performance (style points awarded by the jumping judges)
- Points for in-run length difference (metres converted to gate compensation points)
- Points for tangential wind speed and direction (metres per second converted to wind compensation points)

PENALTIES/DISQUALIFICATION RULES

The most common grounds for disqualification of a competitor include the following: arriving late to the start line (Ski Jumping), violating specific rules for competition equipment, using non-authorized help, exceeding the start control time, starting before the hill-clear signal, or intentionally delaying readiness to start.

The Alpensia Ski Jumping Centre was completed in 2007 and hosted the 2017 FIS Nordic Combined World Cup, 2017 FIS Ski Jumping World Cup, and the Winter Olympic Games PyeongChang 2018.

I SPORT EQUIPMENT STORAGE

As a general principle, ski equipment is not allowed in the YOY except for ski boots. There will be wax cabins where athletes will store and use their equipment (skis, etc.) located in the competition venues in times of training or competitions.

I ATHLETES' LOUNGE

The Athletes' Lounge will open daily according to the official training and competition schedules. All competitors can use the lounge for two hours before and one hour after both the official training and the competition. The detailed operation schedule will be re-announced once confirmed.

The following services will be available:

- Chairs, tables, Olympic sponsored soft drinks, bottled water, hot soup, fruits, cookies, and energy bars

I SECURITY

SECURITY MANAGEMENT AT COMPETITION VENUES

Certain part of some competition venues will be designated as restricted areas. Such restricted areas as well as their surrounding areas will be patrolled by security staff or relevant organizations. To enter the venue, visitors are requested to present their YOAC or valid admission tickets.

- Safety of the surrounding areas of the venues
 - Police mobile unit will be dispatched to patrol on regular basis and maintain the order.
 - Police stations and fire stations in the region will be ready for emergency dispatches at all times.
- Restricted and prohibited items
 - Please refer to the list of prohibited and restricted items in [the SEC chapter of the CdM Guide \(Annex 1\)](#).

SECURITY AT OTHER EVENTS AND VENUES

The security will be provided for all events and venues of Gangwon 2024.

- The maintenance of public, both inside and outside of the venue, will be monitored to ensure the safety of spectators during the Opening and Closing Ceremonies.
- Relevant organizations, such as the police and fire brigade will conduct regular patrols at the NOC Hotels. A direct communication channel will be established between the NOC Hotels and the Gangwon 2024 SEC Team.

- Fire facilities will be inspected in advance, and fire truck and ambulances will be stationed in the nearest possible location to promptly respond to any emergencies.
